

Credit for courses completed at another institution is given based on recommendation by the person who convenes the equivalent UCT course. The course convenor would make this decision based on whether the course is academically equivalent to the UCT course. The decision would be made using any course material available from the course completed by the student at the previous institution, such as course outlines, textbooks, copies of test and exam papers and assignments set.

Until a student registers at UCT, we are unable to ask the individual course convenors to do this, as you will understand it is a time consuming exercise.

In the case of certain courses, such as Financial Reporting I and II courses, being granted a credit for the course does not automatically enable the student to progress to the next year of study in that course. The progression requirement for students completing these courses at UCT is that they obtain 60% or more in the final exam; students transferring from another institution are expected to write and obtain 60% or more for the final or supplementary exam also.
