We invite applications for this contract post as part of a dynamic and growing team of demographers for appointment for two years from 1 January 2006 or as soon as possible thereafter. Subject to funding and performance, the appointment will be renewable and in the longer term, depending on growth in graduate and student numbers, the post may be made permanent.

This is a key position within one of the premier demographic teaching and research programmes in Southern Africa. The interdisciplinary programme combines research and teaching from a number of departments across the University. CARE has built up internationally recognised expertise in the modelling of the demographic dynamics of HIV, as well as in the estimation of demographic parameters from limited or defective data.

You will contribute to all aspects of the programme's work, including teaching at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, supervising master's and, where appropriately qualified to do so, doctoral theses, as well as conducting research at the highest level. In particular, you must have a keen interest in both teaching and developing techniques of demographic estimation from deficient data appropriate to developing countries.

A PhD in Demography with a strong quantitative orientation is essential, as is a research track record in the field of demographic estimation in developing countries. Experience in similar positions, regionally or internationally, would prove advantageous.

The level of the post will be determined according to the skills and qualifications of the successful applicant. A remuneration package in line with the University's recommended payscales will apply.
